The best new hotels for 2019

From a luxurious retreat in California's wine country to a beachside party palace in Ibiza, Annabelle Thorpe has the pick of next year's openings

Long haul

1 Arithaus Gemmayze Beirut, Lebanon

Few cities can match Beirut for its defiant, life-affirming energy, and this new hotel, opening in March, channels that vibrancy, with temporary art exhibitions, exotic gardens and classic palazzo-style. The 19 distinctly sumptuous suites are spread across four whitewashed houses; the rooftop terrace bar is perfect for sunset cocktails and dinner can be taken in the dining room, lounge, bar or garden.

2 Alila Villas

Koh Rong, Cambodia

A collection of 63 simply styled yet indulgent villas and suites, Alila Villas offers absolute relaxation. Guests drift from the beachfront infinity pool to the spa for coconut-based treatments, and across to the beach shack for spicy Khmer seafood before sundowners in the bar. To mix things up, a shuttle boat runs trips to the mainland for temple tours, and the hotel can arrange island-hopping adventures. It will be fully open on January 1.

3 Four Seasons

Napa Valley, US

Vineyard will feel much to love where the Four Seasons opens in the heart of California's wine country in mid-2019. The 85 rooms are in earthy chocolate-and-cream tones, all with fireplaces and private terraces that overlook the five-acre vineyard. Families are welcome, with the All Seasons kids' club to keep younger ones happy, while couples can chill by the adults-only pool, or retreat to one of the two vineyard
