The best new hotels for 2019

From a luxurious retreat in California's wine country to a beachside party palace in Ibiza, **Annabelle Thorpe** has the pick of next year's openings

Long haul

1 **Arthaus Gemmayze Beirut, Lebanon**

Few cities can match Beirut for its defiant, life-affirming energy, and this new hotel, opening in March, channels that vibrancy, with temporary art exhibitions, exotic gardens and classic palazzo style. The 19 discreetly located bedrooms are spread across four buildings and the rooftop terrace bar is perfect for sunset cocktails and dinner can be taken in the dining room, lounge, bar or garden.

2 **Ailla Villas Koh Rongsey, Cambodia**

A collection of 63 simply styled yet indulgent villas and suites, Ailla Villas offers absolute relaxation. Guests drift from the beachfront infinity pool to the spa for incense-based treatments, and across to the beach shack for spicy Khmer seafood before sundowners in the bar. To mix things up, a shuttle boat runs trips to the mainland for temple hours, and the hotel can arrange island hopping adventures. It will be fully open in January 1.

3 **Four Seasons Napa Valley, US**

Vineophiles will find much to love when the Four Seasons opens in the heart of California's wine country in mid-2019. The 85 rooms are in earthy chocolate-and-cream tones, all with fireplaces and private terraces that overlook the five-acre vineyard. Families are welcome, with the All Seasons kids' club to keep younger ones happy, while couples can chill by the adults-only pool, or retreat to one of the two vineyard v-
